# **Home Fire Safety Checklist**

#### **Electrical items**

Check all electrical items for damage, replace the item if it is damaged
Install an electrical safety switch (this is required by law)
Test your electrical safety switch
Don't overload powerpoints or use double adapters. Use good quality powerboards.
Roll electrical blankets for storage (never fold)
Test the electrical blankets before use
Keep filters clean on clothes dryers and air conditioners
Install powerpoint guards if there are small children in the house
Only used licensed electricians to do any electrical work in your house

#### **Fire Safety**

Install photoelectric smoke alarms (this is required by law), preferably interconnected
Vacuum and test your smoke alarms regularly
Store chemicals in a safe area away from sources of ignition
Store matches and lighters away from children
Develop a home escape plan (see <a href="https://www.qfes.qld.gov.au">www.qfes.qld.gov.au</a> for great resources)
Practice your home escape plan with all the family (where is your safe meeting spot?)
Install a fire extinguisher and a fire blanket in an easily accessible area
Don't leave candles burning when you are sleepy or in bed

#### When to use a fire blanket

A fire blanket is ideal for extinguishing cooking fat fires and can be used to wrap around people if their clothes catch on fire.

## Use a fire extinguisher ONLY if:

- you know that the extinguisher is suitable for use on the flammable materials involved in the fire;
- you have considered whether electricity is possibly involved and, if so, that the available extinguishing agent is non-conducting;
- · you can extinguish the fire quickly;
- you are not putting your safety at risk by staying in the vicinity of the fire; and
- all other persons have been evacuated from the area.

- Stay calm, don't shout, speak slowly and clearly.
- Tell us exactly where to come. Give an address or location.
